In this classroom...

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Students are expected to follow the following rules:

- 1. **Respect** others and their property.
- 2. Be Prepared bring all needed materials to class
- 3. Arrive on Time be seated and ready to begin when the bell rings.
- 4. Talk at appropriate times and use appropriate language.
- 5. Obey all School Rules.

Student's that do not follow school or classroom rules may have citizenship points deducted, and/or receive a detention, and/or may be sent to the office. Student's that show classroom success may be given tickets that will be put in a weekly raffle. Late work can be turned in before or by the chapter test date it belongs to. Late work can only earn up to 50% credit. Students may take advantage of one retake per assessment; but must complete an assessment correction, come in on their own time to retake, and retake before the grading period ends. The assessments final grade will consist of averaging the original assessment and the retake.

Plagiarizing and academic dishonesty will not be tolerated. This means no work may be copied in whole or in part from other students or from other printed materials. Students who are caught plagiarizing or cheating will receive an automatic zero on the assignment, quiz, or test; in addition to a referral to the school counselor and a parent contact. Sinaloa's full policy on academic dishonesty can be found in the agenda book.

It is the student's responsibility to be prepared for class each day. Suggested materials to bring to class: Big Ideas Math course 2 textbook, lined and graph paper, agenda book, pencils, scientific calculator, grading pen/marker, highlighter, dry erase marker and eraser. If you are unable to get materials, please see the teacher so together a plan can be put into place to ensure students are prepared for class each and every day!

Students are responsible for their own learning and behavior. Students should use their agenda book daily to keep track of their assignments. Students are responsible for making up assignments that were missed due to tardies or absences.

Grading Policy:

The student's degree of mastery of the California Academic Standards is the critical element in determining the letter grade in this class. Your student will demonstrate mastery in this class by the following rubrics:

Student's grades will be weighted based on the following breakdown:

Assessments (Tests & Quizzes) 50% Performance Tasks 20% Class work 20% Homework 10% A student's effort grade will be calculated by averaging their homework and class work grades each quarter. Citizenship grades will be determined by a student's classroom behavior and participation. The following rubric is used for effort and citizenship:

Tardy and Absence Policies

- School Tardy Policy: On-time arrival at every class is a component of school citizenship (see the Agenda Book). More than 3 tardies to class each quarter will result in an "N" (Needs Improvement) citizenship grade. More than 4 tardies to class will result in a "U" (Unsatisfactory) grade in Citizenship.
- Classroom Absence Policy: Students are responsible to make-up any work missed due to absences. Students can find what assignments they missed in the absent folder in class. Homework assignments will also be posted on Aries. Absent work must be turned in by the number of days the student was absent for full credit. (For example if a student is absent for 3 days, they would have 3 days starting the day they return to turn in the assignments missed.)
